As I've been reporting, this is a big year for Cartier Resources, as the company has embarked on a number of high-profile exploration campaigns on its project portfolio in Quebec.

The newsmaker of late has been the company's 100%-owned Cadillac Extension project, located 115 kilometers east of Val d'Or, Quebec. This base and precious metal property has been turning in some intriguing channel samples.

Highlights from a systematic sampling of the project's Langlade polymetallic zone include a 10.0-meter sample of 3.03% copper, 1.63% zinc and 83.57 g/t silver, which was drawn from a broader, 58.0-meter sample grading 1.00% copper, 1.11% zinc, 31.84 g/t silver.

These impressive samples come from a zone at Langlade that is open both laterally and at depth. The structure identified here is contained within alteration and mineralized rock units that are folded and plunge shallowly toward the east. In combination with these channel samples, the company has also conducted detailed mapping of Langlade with the goal of creating a three-dimensional model of the area to identify drilling targets.

In addition to the significant zones of high-grade copper and zinc uncovered by this sampling effort, the company has also recently encountered some interesting precious metal grades

at Cadillac Extension. The best sample measured 7.0 meters in length and graded 109.26 g/t silver and 0.95 g/t gold. It boasted a narrower 1.0-meter interval of 392.10 g/t silver and 1.22 g/t gold.

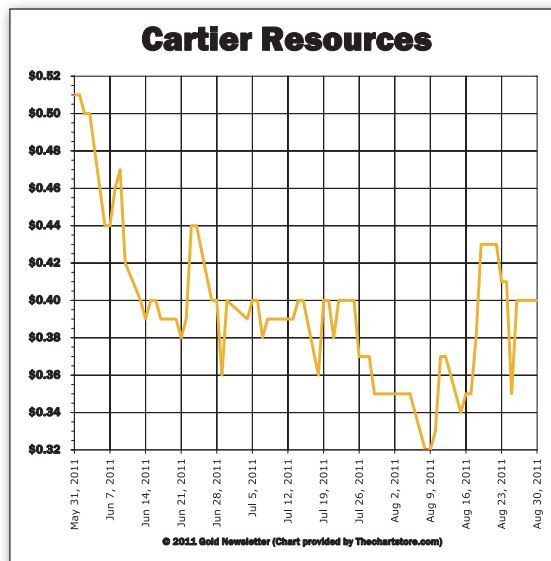
These grades came from a zone at Langlade peripheral to the copper-zinc rich grades outlined in the above mentioned samples. Like those samples, these gold-silver rich samples are narrow-vein, but high-grade. That means if drilling can confirm the continuity of these surface zones at depth, it won't take much mineralization at these grades to translate into a rich, albeit compact, deposit of base and precious metals.

Combined with the drilling and exploration work being done this field season on Cartier's other Quebec projects, the company should have no shortage of news flow in the months ahead.

Given the recent volatility in the rest of market and given that the company has maintained its share price in the face of this volatility, Cartier Resources is a buy.
